



POSTER PARTICIPATION

Purpose: The research poster project requires the coordinated participation of all the members in our laboratory section. The failure of one or more members to carry their share of the load will negatively impact the entire class. As an incentive for participation, your peers will score you based upon their perceptions of your contribution to the project. I will also score your individual contributions to the poster project with this ten-point rubric this semester.

Points: Your individual contributions will be scored out of twenty possible points. Ten points from your peers and ten points from me.

Instructions: You do not need to specifically submit anything in class for these points. Instead, I will be evaluating your participation in collecting and posting laboratory results for our project and your involvement in the online discussions concerning the refinements to our poster sections.

Due Date: Your participation will be graded on November 22, 2010.

Grading Criteria: Your participation will be scored using the following rubrics.

Score	Description
10-points	The student correctly and accurately followed all laboratory procedures for the experiment. Appropriate data was collected and posted to the website in a timely manner. The student regularly participated in the development of the poster online - this includes frequent comments and/or attachments being posted and regular involvement in the editing of their assigned section.
8-points	The student followed most of the laboratory procedures for the experiment. Appropriate data was collected and posted to the website in a timely manner. The student participated in the development of the poster online. This includes making two or more comments and/or attachments being posted and regular involvement in the editing of their assigned section.
6-points	The student followed most laboratory procedures for the experiment. Appropriate data was collected and posted to the website. The student occasionally participated in the development of the poster online. This includes making a comment and/or an attachment being posted and some involvement in the editing of their assigned section.
4-points	The student followed some of the laboratory procedures for the experiment. Partial data was collected and posted to the website. The student rarely participated in the development of the poster online. They never posted comments or attachments but did work some in the editing of their assigned section.
2-points	The student did not follow laboratory procedures for the experiment. Questionable data was collected and posted to the website. The student never participated in the development of the poster online. This means no comments and/or attachments were posted nor was their any involvement in the editing of their assigned section.
